#### Start of PSHE lessons

We are pleased to inform you that we have started a new subject called Personal Social Health and Economic Education. PSHE is statutory subject in the British National Curriculum and we are delighted to offer it. The first two lessons were conducted on Tuesday and Wednesday this week.

#### What is PSHE and what is its benefit?

PSHE (personal, social, health and economic) education is a school curriculum subject through which pupils develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to manage their lives, now and in the future.

PSHE education helps pupils to stay healthy, safe and prepared for life – and work – in modern world. When taught well, PSHE also helps pupils to achieve their academic potential.

#### Why is PSHE education important to pupils?


PSHE education helps pupils to develop the knowledge, skills and attributes they need to thrive as individuals, family members and members of society. From making responsible decisions about drug substances to succeeding in their first job, PSHE education helps pupils to manage many of the most critical opportunities, challenges and responsibilities they will face growing up.

#### Why is PSHE education important to schools?

PSHE education makes a crucial contribution to schools' duties. The Education Act requires all schools to teach a curriculum that is 'broadly based, balanced and meets the needs of pupils'. Schools must 'promote the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of pupils at the school and of society, and prepare pupils at the school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life' while having a duty to keep pupils safe. A growing body of research shows that pupils who are emotionally healthy do better at school. PSHE education helps children and young people to achieve their potential by supporting their wellbeing and tackling issues that can affect their ability to learn, such as anxiety and unhealthy relationships. PSHE education also helps pupils to develop skills and aptitudes — like teamwork, communication, and resilience — that are crucial to navigating the challenges and opportunities of the modern world, and are increasingly valued by employers.

#### Why is PSHE education important to parents?

An overwhelming majority of parents support the view that schools should help prepare children for life and careers alongside academic success. Parents welcome a partnership between home and schools which supports their children's personal and social development, and helps to deal with issues of increasing complexity such as those related to mental health and staying safe, both online and offline.
