SPARKLE PROGRAMME – A VISIT TO AFRICA DEVELOPMENT CENTER (MICROSOFT AFRICA DEVELOPMENT CENTER)

The Sparkle Program, curated by the U.S. Embassy in collaboration with Microsoft Africa Development Center, invited 15 of our female students. This program targeted exceptional girls ages 15 and older who have a demonstrated interest in science, technology, and how things work. It was designed to inspire young girls to pursue careers in Science Technology Engineering and Math (STEM) by presenting them an opportunity to ask questions and tinker with technology available on site. They learned about design thinking and problem solving as they went through specially prepared experiences leading up to a mini hackathon at the end of the day.
