Cambridge Upper Secondary Science Competition 2023 BEST TEAM IN KENYA


BEST IN COUNTR WINNER



OXFORD PROGRAMME FROM STUDENT'S EXPERIENCE




Khushi Bhavesh Malde's Achievements in Table Tennis during the past summer holidays 2023.




Finally, Khushi was interviewed by Asian Weekly, and she was on the front page with the full article.


KAISSO BADMINTON TOURNAMENT 2023




















TREE PLANTING INITIATIVE
