During a professional talk on self-awareness, year 8 students were urged to develop selfawareness by comprehending their values, interests, abilities, and personalities.










YEAR 9 CAREER TALK ON CAREER DEVELOPMENT, SUBJECT AREAS AND PSYCHOMETRIC TESTS
