Moral of the Story: Failure is not the end; it's a chance to learn and improve. If you keep trying and don't give up, you can turn your failures into success.

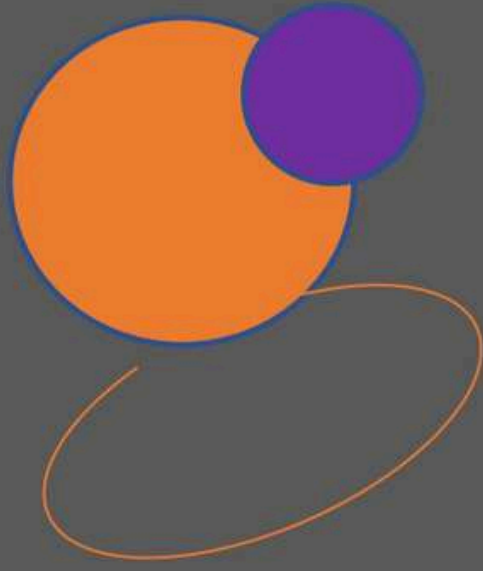
